

TRAVELLING TO BRNO

Brno is situated about 2,5 hours by car south-east of Prague (200 km) and about 2 hours by car north of Vienna (100 km).

▪ BY AIR

There are four ways to get to Brno by plane:

Brno airport (www.airport-brno.cz)

RyanAir (www.ryanair.com) is operating flights to **London (Stansted)** and **Barcelona (Gerona)**, **Smart Wings** (www.smartwings.com) flights to **Moskva (Vnukovo)** and **Czech airlines** (www.csa.cz) flights to **Prague (Ruzyne)**.

Vienna international airport (www.viennaairport.com) in Austria is about 2 hours drive from Brno.

Student Agency (www.studentagency.cz) operates direct bus connection from Vienna (airport, city) to Brno. There are four connections each day (Vienna airport->Brno – 8:05 a.m., 11:05 a.m., 6:05 p.m., 8:30 p.m., Brno->Vienna airport – 3:05 a.m., 6:00 a.m., 1:15 p.m., 15:15 p.m.). Transport by bus from Vienna airport to Brno takes about 2,5 hours. Price of transport: 300 CZK (€ 12).

Alternatively, there is a fast transport link (S-Bahn) from the airport to the centre of Vienna calling at the railway station that serves Brno. **Czech Railways** (www.cd rail.cz) operate **quick IC, EC connections** between **Vienna-Brno-Prague**.

Prague (Ruzyne) international airport (www.csa.cz)

in the Czech Republic is about 2 hours drive from Brno. There is a good motorway connection. **Czech airlines** (www.csa.cz) is operating (twice a day) flights **Praha-Brno**.

Student Agency (www.studentagency.cz) operates **direct bus connection from Prague (city, airport) to Brno**. There are more than ten connections in both directions each day. Transport by bus from Prague airport takes 3,5 hours. Price of transport 150 – 190 CZK (€ 6– 8).

Bratislava international airport (www.letiskobratislava.cz)

in Slovakia is a smaller airport but some low-cost airlines use it. There is a bus line (no. 61) from the airport to the central train (and bus) station that serves Brno.

▪ BY RAIL

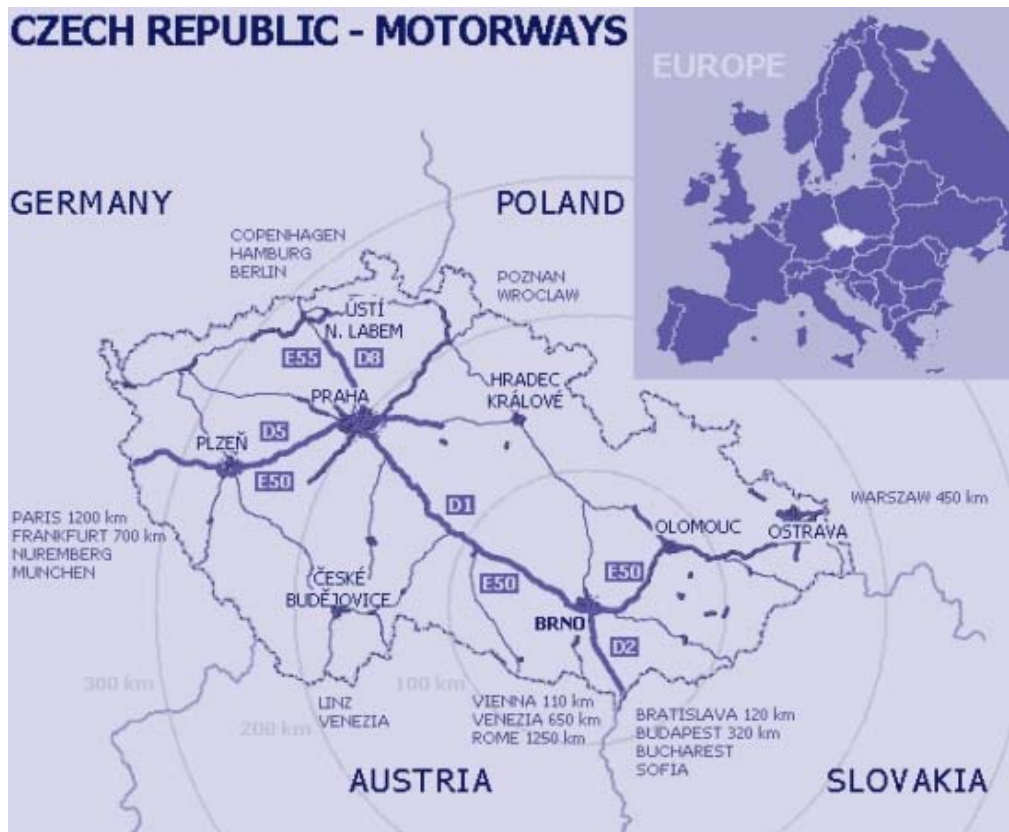
Brno is one of the most important Central European rail junctions, as it is situated on the international Balkan-Budapest-Prague-Berlin-Scandinavia rail route. Euro City trains on the Vienna-Prague route have stopped at Brno since 1991, and the City of Brno is taking an active part in the VRT, a project for the creation of a European network of high-speed rail routes.

Czech Railways (www.cd rail.cz) operate **quick IC, EC connections** between **Vienna-Brno-Prague**.

▪ BY ROAD

Brno is situated at the intersection of the D1 (Prague - Brno) and D2 (Brno - Bratislava) motorways. Both these motorways form part of the trans-European highways East-West (France - Ukraine: E50) and North-South (Scandinavia - the Balkans: E55, E65).
